Military Recreation provides programs, services, and activities for all aspects of life in the military community for those deployed abroad and those serving at home. Military Recreation addresses the physical, cultural and social needs and general well-being of service members and their families, providing community support systems that make Department of Defense (DOD) installations temporary hometowns for a mobile military population. MWR programs include clubs, libraries, recreation centers, marinas, organized sports, golf, physical fitness, aquatics, outdoor recreation, equipment rental, leisure travel, and other related activities. Every branch of the US Military has its own Military Recreation program. Positions maybe funded with either appropriated funds (APF) or non-appropriated funds (NAF), with different application methods for each.
